### <u>United Nations Decade of Ocean Science Launches in the United States</u>

January 2021 marks the beginning of the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable

Development (2021 – 2030). The goal of the Decade is to unite ocean stakeholders worldwide behind a common framework to ensure sustainable use of ocean resources and reverse the cycle of decline in long-term ocean health. In a two-day virtual event, on February 3 and 4, the US National Committee for the Ocean Decade, chaired by MTS member Larry Mayer and vice chaired by MTS Past-President Rick Spinrad, kicked off the US activities by fostering engagement, dialog, and ideation around transformative research efforts. Over 800 individuals attended and more than eighty transformative concepts called "Ocean-Shots" were presented to address the challenges of the Decade.

A second <u>call for Ocean-Shots</u> is open until April 1, 2021 and a directory of those submitted prior to the February event will be made available soon. Meantime, you may view the session recordings on the <u>event webpage</u>.

and those authors will be invited to submit a full paper. The final technical papers will be featured in OCEANS' prestigious technical program. (For any author who has already submitted an abstract to OCEANS 2021 Porto, the abstract will automatically be transferred to Global OCEANS 2021.)

Global OCEANS 2021 will be a hybrid conference, with both on-site and virtual components. Authors submitting abstracts to the technical program will be given the option to present either on-site in San Diego or through the conference's virtual platform.

Abstracts and full technical papers must fall under one of the **topics** for this year's event. **ABSTRACT DEADLINE IS APRIL 19.**

The MTS membership elected *Jose Alfredo Giron Nava* to serve as Vice President, Early


Career Ocean Professionals. His term will run from

March 1, 2021 to December 31, 2022. Mr. Giron Nava will represent the interests of Early Career Ocean Professionals within the Society, will serve on the membership advisory group and the budget and finance committee, and will serve a two-year non-renewable term.

Alfredo is an André Hoffmann Fellow at the Stanford Center for Ocean Solutions and the World Economic Forum Centre for the Fourth Industrial Revolution. His work focuses on the use of technology to support sustainable fisheries management and the reduction of Illegal, Unregulated and Unreported catch at a global scale. His previous experience includes projects for sustainable fisheries management in the U.S., Mexico, Canada, Palau, Solomon Islands, the European Union, and a series of studies at a global scale. He has more than 10 years of experience thinking of ways to better communicate science and display data in meaningful ways, such as in the platform dataMares, which he co-founded in 2014. Since May 2019, Alfredo is one of the co-founders of the Early Career Ocean Professionals (ECOP) working group for the IOC-UNESCO, which seeks to give opportunities for ECOP to engage in international ocean sustainability conversations.

Alfredo is the first recipient of the Walter Munk Scholar Award by the Marine Technology Society and the Walter Munk Foundation for the Oceans in recognition of his work on using science and technology to improve the state of the ocean. He is also an EthicalGEO Fellow by the American Geographical Society for his work on developing methods to characterize poverty in fishing
